THE EYE CENTER OF COLUMBUS

An Ambulatory Surgery Center (ASC) is a facility where procedures that do not require a hospital admission are performed. Patients who elect to have a procedure in an ASC arrive the day of the procedure, have the procedure in the Operating Room, and recover under the care of the nursing staff, all without hospital admission.

At The Eye Center of Columbus, we focus our attention on making your outpatient experience as pleasant as possible. Our highly trained staff and your physician combine state-of-the-art equipment and compassion to provide you with the highest quality of care in a supportive environment. Your personal comfort and rapid recovery are our highest priorities. We are qualified to provide a variety of eye outpatient procedures including: cataract, retinal, plastic surgery, as well as refractive and laser procedures.

HOURS OF OPERATION

The ASC is open Monday through Friday from 6:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. Please know that the ASC does not offer emergency or after hours care. Therefore, should you require immediate treatment for a problem following your procedure, please contact your physician's answering service. In an emergency, please call 911.

QUESTIONS OR CONCERNS YOU MAY HAVE

We understand that you probably have questions and concerns about your procedure. Our staff is available to answer your questions. Please let us know how we may be of assistance. Our goal is to make your experience with us a positive one.

PREPARING FOR YOUR PROCEDURE

PRIOR TO YOUR PROCEDURE

- A nurse from the Surgery Center will call before the day of your procedure to: Review your medical history and instruct you on any medications you should take.
- Answer any question you may have about your procedure.
- If you have not heard from a member of our staff by **3:00pm** on the day **prior** to your procedure, please call us at: 614-827-6657.
- A staff member of our business office will contact you if you have any *required financial responsibilities* to the Surgery Center. As part of our efforts to serve our community, we gladly accept Medicare assignment and participate in a number of managed care and insurance programs. We accept; American Express, Discover, MasterCard, Visa, Care Credit, and Debit cards.
- Feel free to visit the Surgery Center prior to your procedure. This may help you feel more at ease on the day of your procedure. Please call us to arrange an appointment.
- If you suspect that you are pregnant, please notify your physician. Sedation and certain medications may be harmful to the developing baby.
- A history and physical must be performed within 30 days prior to your surgery. For your convenience, this can be scheduled the same day of surgery.
- **Do Not** drink any alcoholic beverage during the 24 hours before and after your surgery.

THE NIGHT BEFORE YOUR PROCEDURE

- Please do not eat or drink anything after midnight the night before your procedure including gum, water, mints or vitamins, unless you were given instructions stating otherwise. This is very important for your safety. If you do not do this, your procedure may have to be delayed or rescheduled.
- *Please* shower, bathe and wash your hair.

THE MORNING OF YOUR PROCEDURE

- **DO NOT** eat or drink anything in the morning unless you have been given special instructions stating otherwise.
- **DO** brush your teeth, but do not swallow any water.
- **DO NOT** wear jewelry, and leave all valuables at home. The Eye Center of Columbus is not responsible for lost articles. If you wear glasses or contacts, please bring a case with you.
- **DO** wear casual, comfortable, loose-fitting clothing. Button down shirts work well; you may be asked to undress for surgery.
- **DO** bring your inhalers and insulin if you currently use these types of medications.
- **DO** bring a list of all your medications with dosage and frequencies.
- **DO** bring your insurance card, drivers' license and or a picture ID and your Medicare card (if applicable).
- **DO** bring a friend or family member to wait for you during the procedure. During your recovery, two family members are permitted to visit.
- **IF** your pre-admission testing is to be done the day of surgery, please report to Primary Care Physicians in Room 230 (2nd floor) of The Eye Center Building.
- **IF** your pre-admission testing was completed by your Primary Care Physician, please report to the 5th floor of The Eye Center Building.
- **IF** you need to reach us the morning of your surgery, please call: 614-827-6600.

AFTER YOUR PROCEDURE

- **YOU MUST HAVE A RESPONSIBLE ADULT WITH YOU TO DRIVE YOU HOME OR ACCOMPANY YOU IF YOU PLAN TO USE A TAXI SERVICE.**
- You will rest in our recovery room under the care of specially trained nurses for at least 30 minutes. You may be sleepy or dizzy after your procedure.
- Your physician will monitor your condition.
- Nurses and physicians will answer your questions and provide you with detailed instructions. You will receive a written copy of these instructions, please follow them carefully.
- *Have someone plan to stay at home with you through the night.*
- **DO NOT** make any important decisions, drive or operate machinery for 24hrs after your procedure.

WHEN YOU GET HOME

- Patients May experience minor after effects following anesthesia such as; drowsiness or dizziness. Nausea may also be present but is less common. Please call our physician if any of these symptoms persist.
- The majority of patients feel up to their typical activities the next day depending upon their procedure.
- Contact your surgeon if you have questions about what you can and cannot do, how active you can be, and when you can return to work.

PATIENT RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES: Eye Center of Columbus, LLC

- Considerate, respectful care at all times and under all circumstances with recognition of your personal dignity.
- Personal and informational privacy and security for self and property.
- Have a surrogate (parent, legal guardian, person with medical power of attorney) exercise the Patient Rights when you are unable to do so, without coercion, discrimination or retaliation.
- Confidentiality of records and disclosures and the right to access information contained in your clinical record. Except when required by law, you have the right to approve or refuse the release of records.
- Information concerning your diagnosis, treatment and prognosis, to the degree known.
- Participate in decisions involving your healthcare and be fully informed of and to consent or refuse to participate in any unusual, experimental or research project without compromising your access to services.
- Competent caring healthcare providers who act as your advocates and treats your pain as effectively as possible.
- Know the identity and professional status of individuals providing service and be provided with adequate execution regarding self-care at home, written in language you can understand.
- Be free from unnecessary use of physical or chemical restraint and or seclusion as a means of coercion, convenience or retaliation.
- Know the reason(s) for your transfer either inside or outside the facility.
- Impartial access to treatment regardless of race, age, sex, ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, or disability.
- Receive an itemized bill for all services within a reasonable period of time and be informed of the source of reimbursement and any limitations or constraints placed upon your care.
- File a grievance with the facility by contacting the Director of Nursing, via telephone or in writing, when you feel your rights have been violated:

- Report any comments concerning the quality of services provided to you during the time spent at the facility and receive fair follow-up on your comments.
- Know about any business relationships among the facility, healthcare providers, and others that might influence your care or treatment.

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AS A PATIENT, YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR:

- Providing, to the best of your knowledge, accurate and complete information about our present health status and past medical history and reporting any unexpected changes to the appropriate physician(s).
- Following the treatment plan recommended by the primary physician involved in your case.
- Providing an adult to transport you home after surgery and an adult to be responsible for you at home for the first 24 hours after surgery.
- Indicating whether you clearly understand a contemplated course of action, and what is expected of you, and ask questions when you need further information.
- Your actions if you refuse treatment, leave the facility against the advice of the physician, and/or do not follow the physician's instructions relating to your care.
- Ensuring that the financial obligations of your healthcare are fulfilled as expediently as possible.
- Providing information about, and/or copies of any living will, power of attorney or other directive that you desire us to know about.

Advanced Directives/ Do Not Resuscitate

Eye Center of Columbus Surgery Center

Today, advances in medicine and medical technology save many lives that only 60 years ago might have been lost. Unfortunately, sometimes this same technology also artificially prolongs life for people who have no reasonable hope of recovery.

No one likes to think about death and dying, but they are inescapable realities of life. Armed with the information and forms in this packet, you can take control of choices regarding your medical future.

In 1991, Ohio recognized your right to have a Living Will. This was in addition to Ohio's other recognized advance directive at that time, the Health Care Power of Attorney. In 1998, Ohio recognized yet another tool to help you and your physician with effective health care planning called a DNR (Do-Not-Resuscitate) Order. All of these measures help put control over future medical choices in your hands.

The Living Will allows you to decide and document, in advance, the type of care you would like to receive if you were to become permanently unconscious or terminally ill and unable to communicate. The Health Care Power of Attorney enables you to select someone to make decisions for you.

A person who does not wish to have Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) performed may make this wish known through a doctor's order called a DNR Order. A DNR Order addresses the various methods used to revive people whose hearts have stopped (cardiac arrest) or people who have stopped breathing (respiratory arrest). In 1998, a DNR Law was established to help people communicate their wishes about resuscitation to medical personnel inside or outside a hospital or nursing home setting. It allows emergency medical workers to honor a person's physician-written DNR Order in the home, nursing home or various other settings. The 1998 DNR Law also protects emergency squads and other health care providers from liability if they follow a person's DNR Order.

Following the establishment of the 1998 DNR Law, the Ohio Department of Health established two types of DNR Comfort Care Orders that allow people to choose the extent of the treatment they wish to receive at the end of life. A person with a "DNR Comfort Care Arrest Order" will receive all the appropriate medical treatment, which may include components of CPR, until the person has a cardiac or respiratory arrest, at which point only comfort care will be provided. By requesting the broader "DNR Comfort Care Order," a person is choosing, from the moment the order is written, to have only comfort care measures provided should an event occur that is life threatening or ending. Your physician or health care provider can explain the differences in DNR Orders.

You may have additional questions or concerns specific to your personal situation. In such a case, it is important that you discuss your concerns with your family, your physician, and your lawyer.

Policy for the Eye Center of Columbus Surgery Center: We respect the rights of all patients to participate in decisions regarding their healthcare the policy of the Surgery Center is that all patients undergoing surgical procedures will be considered eligible for life-sustaining emergency treatments.

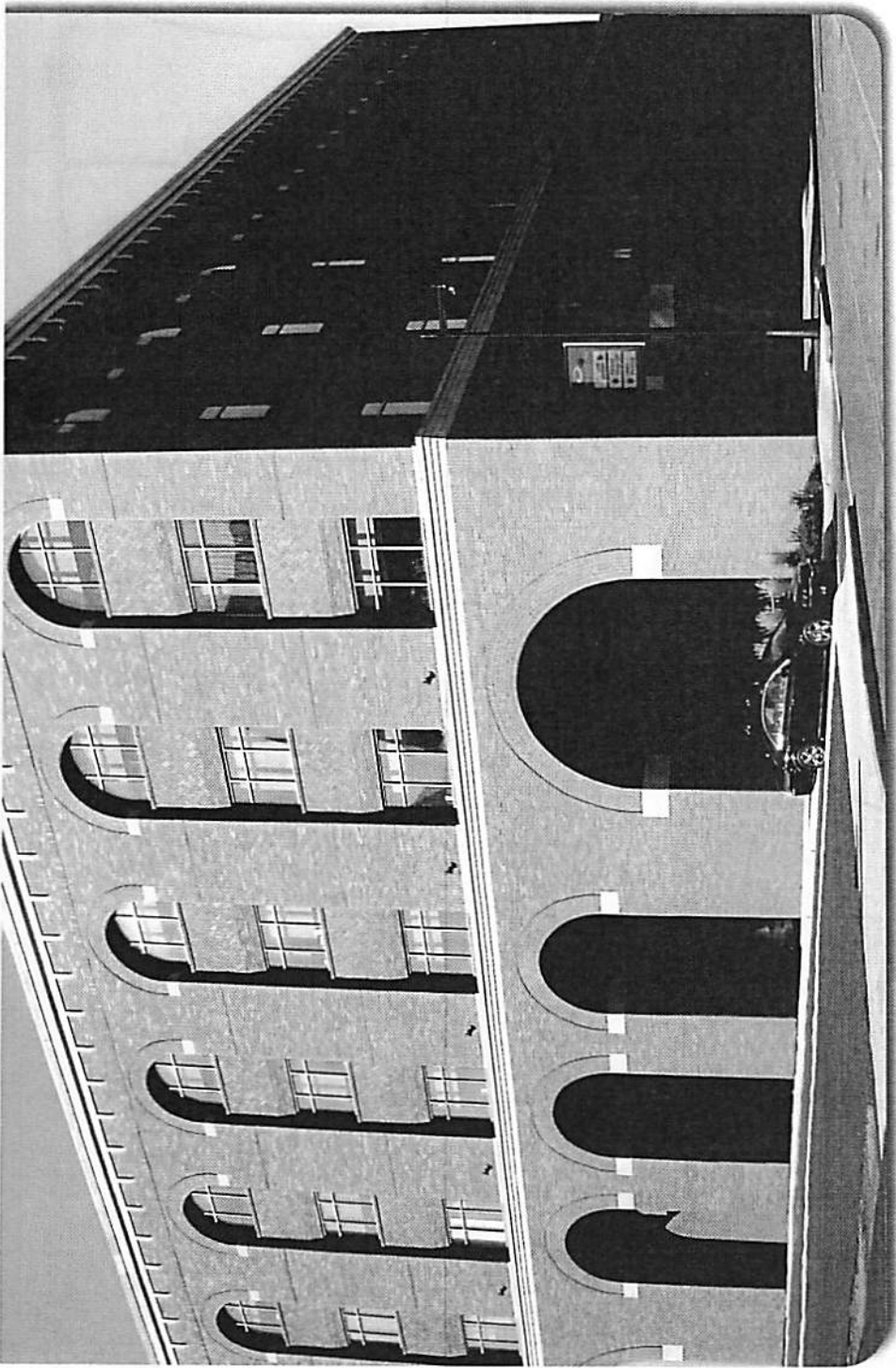

Directions from North

- South on I-71 to I-670 west. Exit at Goodale/Neil Avenue. Turn left at intersection on Neil Avenue. Go 1/2 mile on Neil Avenue. The Eye Center is on the left before the river.
— *or* —
- South on OH-315. Exit at Neil Avenue/Airport. Merge right onto the Neil Avenue exit that turns into the Goodale/Neil Connector. Turn right at intersection onto Neil Avenue. Go 1/2 mile on Neil Avenue. The Eye Center is on the left before the river.

Directions from South

- North on I-71 to US33/Long Street exit. Turn right at intersection onto Long Street. Turn left onto Neil Avenue. The Eye Center will be on your right within 50 yards.

Directions from East

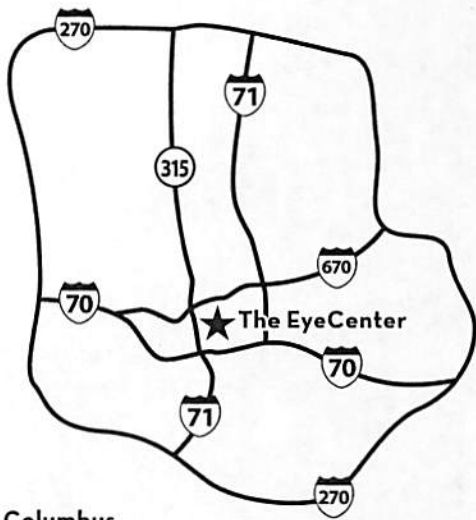
- West on I-70 to I-71 north (exit 101A toward Cleveland). Merge onto I-670 west. Exit at Goodale/Neil Avenue. Turn left at intersection onto Neil Avenue. Go 1/2 mile on Neil Avenue. The Eye Center is on the left before the river.

Direction from West

- East on I-70 to OH-315 north. Exit at US33/Long St. Turn right at intersection onto Long Street. Turn left onto Neil Avenue. The Eye Center will be on your right within 50 yards.

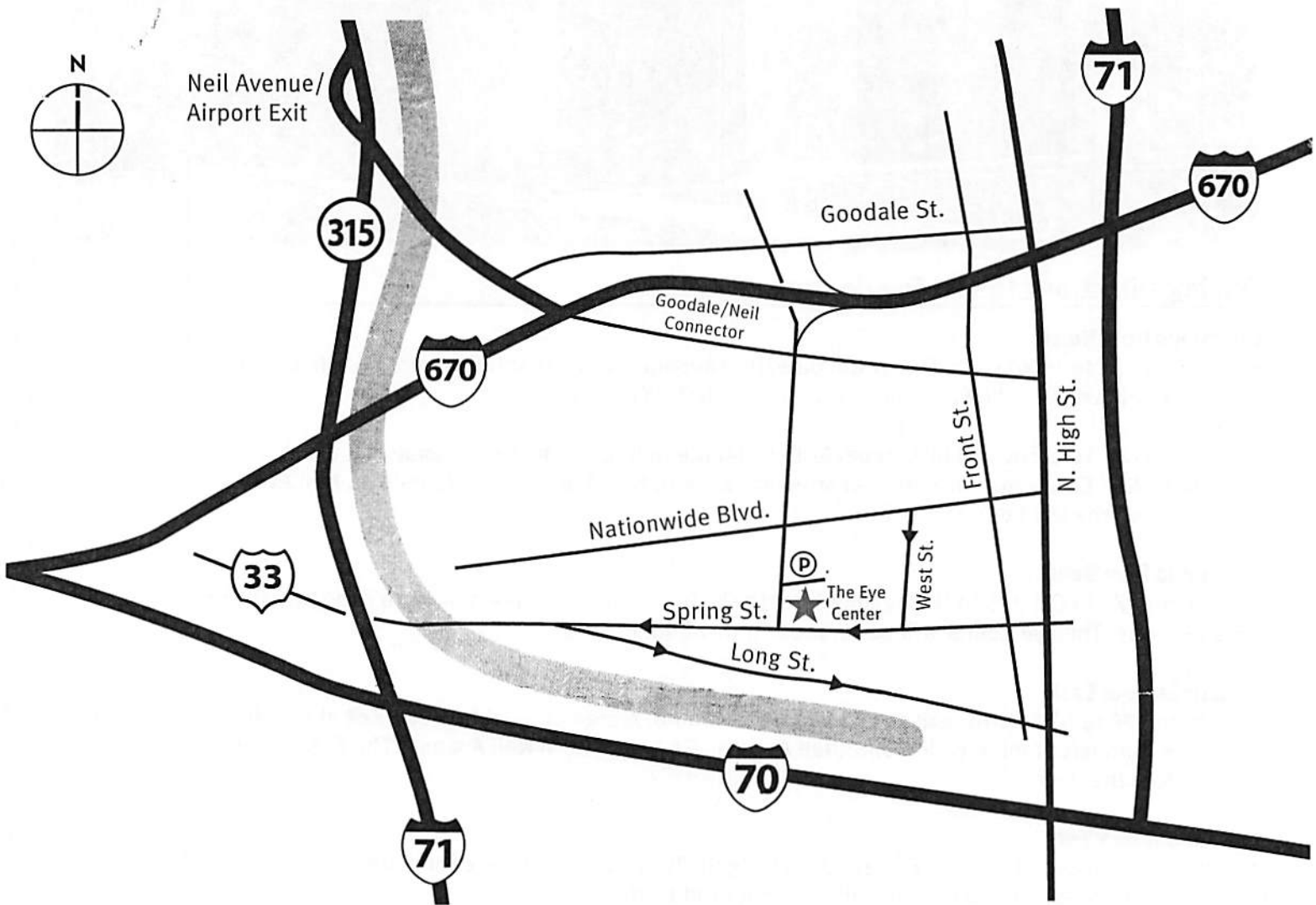
